



































## A message from Robin Beveridge F75:

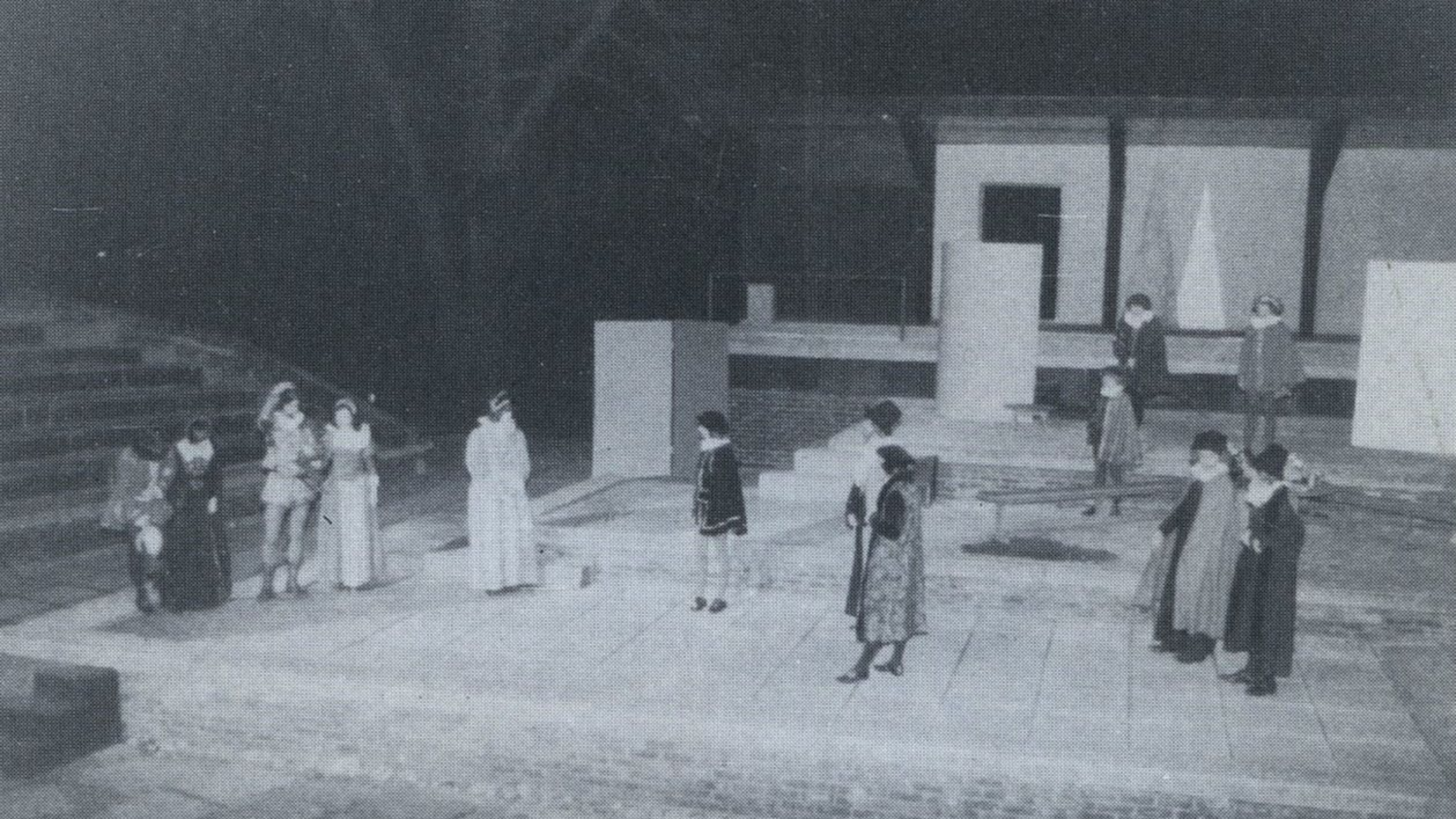
“Sorry we cannot be there at the 1975 reunion.

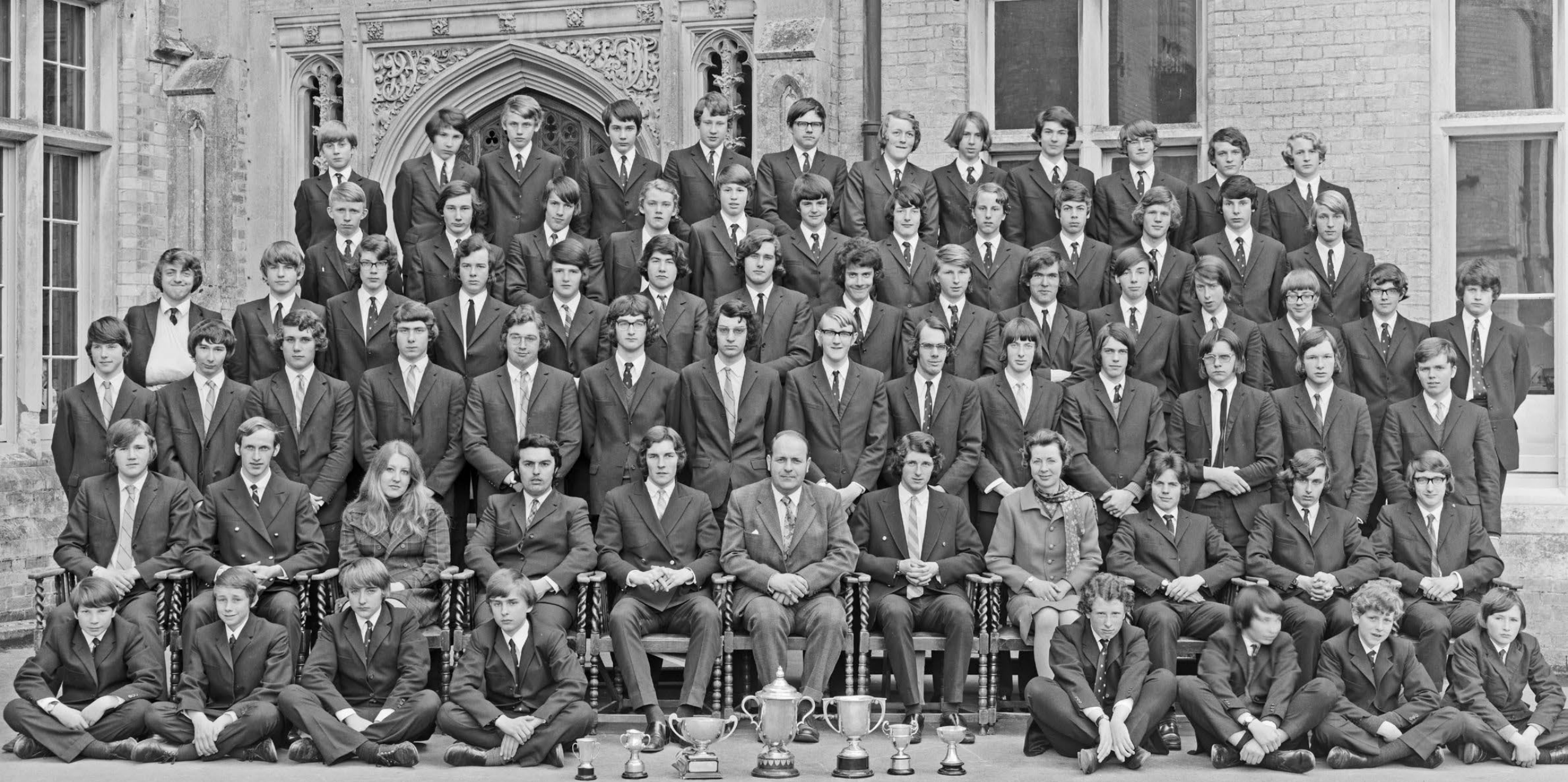




























A message from John Alexander W75:

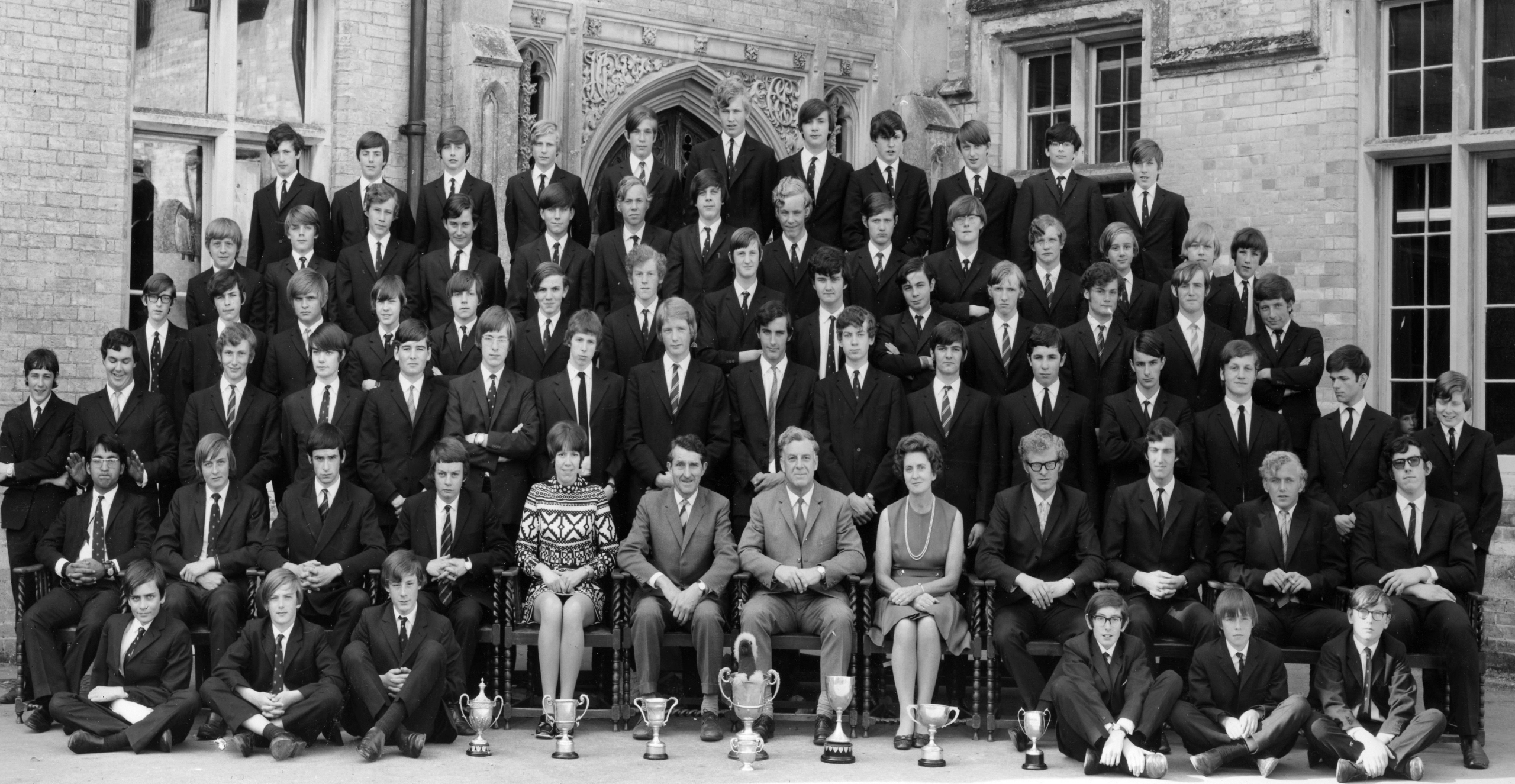
































## A message from Karen Laxton SH75:
